Researchers at the department do not have any teaching obligations but are expected to contribute to the policy work of the department. Voluntary teaching opportunities exist at all levels.

- Strong background in applied econometrics and gender economics or labor economics
- Solid knowledge of administrative and survey data relevant to the research questions of the research group

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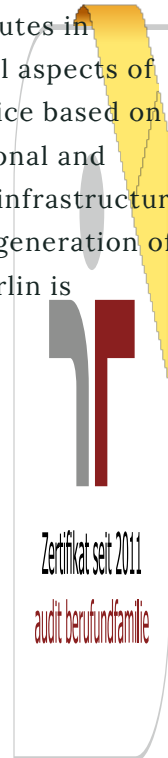
